

### Arizona Board of Regents Requirements

#### **Undergraduate Admissions for the Arizona State University System:**

- 4 years of math
- 4 years of English (non-ESL/ELL courses)
- 3 years lab sciences (1 year from biology, chemistry, earth science, integrated sciences or physics)
- 2 years social sciences (including 1-year American history)
- 2 years same second language
- 1-year fine arts or 1 year career and technical education

## ACT & SAT

### Why and which exam should your student take?

- High school students usually begin taking the assessments their Junior and Senior Years.
- Currently colleges may require a college entrance exam be taken, along with certain cut-off scores as one of the qualifications to be accepted.
- Scholarship opportunities increase.
- We suggest to contact the colleges of interest to learn the requirements for admittance.

- Check into your student's schools of interest to learn which tests they require or prefer.
- Your child does not have to take both exams, your student may choose to take only one assessment type or both.
- ACT allows Super Scoring of top scores. (contact schools of interest to verify if they accept super scoring)

### Early College Credit Programs



#### **Dual Enrollment (DE)**

DE offers courses where a student can earn high school credit along with earning college credit for the same course. The student pays for the course at the beginning of the semester and must maintain a C in order to get college credit. We partner with Rio Community College in providing our Dual Enrollment programs.

For example, a student can take a high school Senior English at the DE course level, while earning English 101 & 102 college credit at the future college your student will be attending.

DE program offerings vary per campus and are available at Horizon, North Canyon, Paradise Valley, Pinnacle, and Shadow Mountain.

#### **Advanced Placement (AP)**

AP gives students the chance to tackle college-level work while they're still in high school—whether they're learning online or in the classroom. And through taking AP Exams, students can earn college credit and placement.

For example, a student can enroll in an AP level course at their high school, at the end of the course there is an optional AP assessment a student may purchase and take. Depending on the student's score the student may qualify for college credit and placement at the college your student will be attending.

AP program offerings vary per campus and are available at Horizon, North Canyon, Paradise Valley, Pinnacle, Shadow Mountain, and PVOnline.

Why? The FAFSA is a financial aid form for accessing, grants, school scholarships, federal student loans, and work study loans.

When? Seniors along with parent complete the form beginning October of their Senior year.

**HOW?** Student and Parent create a FAS ID before student and parent begin filling out the FAFSA
