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Planning for the future of the Arrowhead Site

Meeting Objectives

- Inform the community of viable options and solicit community feedback.
- These options were presented to the Governing Board and feedback was received during a June Board Study Session.
- Based on your feedback along with the Governing Board's input, viable options will be explored and finalized.

Description of the Site

- Originally built in 1976 with additions in 1983, 1985, 1992 and 2008
- Construction is cast in place concrete

Repurposing Option: Facility Sale

- An offer has been received for each site by a local housing developer
- Sale of district land requires the authorization of voters and comes with limitations
- Will not be pursuing facility sales at this time

Repurposing Option: **District & Community Athletic Facilities**

- Current need for community practice fields
- Planning would involve district athletic and community education directors
- Facility, lighting, and parking considerations will be evaluated
- Option may be used in conjunction with other purposes for a site

Repurposing Option: **Professional Meeting Space**

- Current need for staff professional development space
- Upgraded space with current technology would enhance professional development opportunities
- Need for meeting space for larger groups
- Meeting rooms could be rented through community education department as a revenue generator

Repurposing Option: Childcare & Preschool Resources

- Employee requests for childcare and preschool services for staff and the public at locations south of the 101
- Employee childcare could help with teacher recruitment and retention efforts
- Possible relocation of SunKids preschool into updated facilities

Repurposing Option: **Community Resource Center**

- Community education would move their program from the Foothills facility
- Currently provide Mascot programming (childcare) on non-school days
- Successful summer program, “Brown Bear Camp” which hosts over 500 students each summer
- Availability for community meetings/ programming
- Approached by a food bank seeking space

Facility Planning for Receiving Schools

- Review of staffing and classroom needs by site and program
- Assessment of current facilities status
- Develop plans to meet educational needs
- Review drop-off/pick-up and parking areas to ease traffic flow and safety
- Provide a welcoming environment for students and for curb appeal
